The Averill Park Central School District encompasses approximately 120 square miles within a 20-minute drive of Albany and Troy, New York. The district educates approximately 2,625 pupils. The community is residential and rural in character and populated by business, professional, industrial and farm families.

The Library Media Center is a vibrant and student-centered hub of the Averill Park High School. It offers not only reading materials (book, eBooks, audiobooks, magazines, newspapers), but also access to multiple software apps and databases for research and learning. Student work areas are varied, from casual spaces to sit and study to formal instruction spaces. You will find charging stations throughout for both Chromebooks and phones. Our LMC is open to students from 7:00 am to 3:15 pm every day.

Special Curriculum Features

Averill Park High School provides students with access to honors and accelerated course offerings in all of our content areas, as well as Advanced Placement (AP) courses in Studio Art, English, Statistics, US History, Government and Politics, Biology, Physics and Calculus.

Additionally, we maintain articulation agreements with an array of local colleges and universities to provide students with access to more than 20 other college-credit bearing courses in Art, World Language, English, Mathematics, Science, and Technology.

Finally, APHS is proud to offer students a series of in-house pre-engineering pathway courses, in-house State-certified CTE Programs in Automotive and Construction Technology, as well as access to vocational training programs through QUESTAR III.

Special education services are available to all qualified students. These include Resource Room, consultant teacher services and special class as determined by the CSE.



THE HIGH SCHOOL

Averill Park High School is a comprehensive public high school with a student population of approximately 920. APHS utilizes a block schedule which includes eight blocks that meet for 80 minutes every other day. The curriculum is largely Regents level college preparatory.

There are 82 faculty members and 19 assistants/classroom aides. The majority of students pursue a college preparatory program while vocational offerings are available at the high school and through a regional vocational center.



GRADING / CLASS RANK

Numerical grades are awarded 0-100; passing grade is 65. There is no weighting of Advanced Placement or Honors level classes. R signifies Regents, AP is Advanced Placement and H is Honors level.

GPA/Class Rank is computed based on final averages for all courses taken in the first six semesters. Physical Education is not included in class rank/GPA determination.
