2023-24 State Aid



- → Foundation Aid
 - ♦ No Phase-In Due in Prior Years; Overfunded per Formula
 - ◆ 2023-24 Phase-In Amount: \$277,019
 - ◆ Due Hold Harmless 3% Increase
 - ◆ 2023-24 Increase: \$521,298

Foundation Aid Factors



- → Foundation Aid Factors
 - **♦** Enrollment
 - Decrease of 24.1% from 2007-08 to 2023-24
 - Wealth
 - Combined Wealth Ratio- Increase from .62 and .73 between 2007-08 and 2023-24
 - Student Need
 - Free & Reduced Lunch Percentage- Increase from 12.3% to 23.79% between 2007-08 and 2023-24

→ 6.0 Faculty FTE Reductions between 2017-18 and 2020-21

Tax Levy Discussion




- → Tax Base Growth Factor: 1.0102
- → Allowable Growth Factor: 2%
 - ◆ CPI-8.0%
- → Capital Exclusions
 - ◆ Financing for New Project
 - Retiring Debt
- → Multi-Year Approach for Consistency



Debt Service Planning



- **→** 2022-23
 - BAN principal paydown using flood aid
 - **Tax Levy:** 2.93% (\$965,719)
- **→** 2023-24
 - Reduction in debt service payment for old project (\$968k)
 - One year of building aid remaining on project
 - BAN principal paydown to offset aid
 - **Tax Levy:** 2.99% (\$1,009,348)
- **→** 2024-25
 - Reduction in debt service payment for old project
 - Building aid reduction for old project
 - Financing new project for consistent debt
 - **◆ Projected Tax Levy:** 2.98% (\$1,036,843)
