Consequently, grant requests submitted to the Foundation must demonstrate that the project/program and the funds requested will benefit our academic environment and our students.

All grants are subject to approval by the Foundation Board. In general, awards range from \$1,000 - 7,500, although larger proposals will be considered.

All proposals will receive a response generally within 6-8 weeks of each deadline. The dollar amount available for grants per year is directly related to the results of the annual fundraising campaign, and may vary from year to year. The term "e-Sports," for those who are not familiar, describes organized, competitive play of video games in a team format, and for secondary schools, can be an intramural and and/or interscholastic program.

Here at Algonquin, students have expressed interest in e-Sports and we hope to funnel the high level of engagement and commitment students have to playing video games outside of school into the school program through competitive play among our students and then branching out to competition programming with other local middle schools.

Sports and activities offered by the school district need to be representative of student interest in order for them to be engaging and help them feel connected to their school. This after school program will allow students to participate in two eight week sessions. There is equal opportunity to develop skills in leadership, teamwork, and communication in E-Sports as there is in traditional sports. Our hope is that this program will help engage students who may not be attracted to traditional sports programs but can become skilled e-Sports athletes. The social emotional learning components of e-sports such as skill acquisition, health and wellness, and navigating digital culture is well documented in the recently published <u>Esports Education Playbook.</u>

Warrior Wellness Day - The Mind Body Connection

The Averill Park Central School District would like to present a day of mental health awareness and coping called <u>Warrior Wellness - The Mind Body Connection</u> for all students at the secondary level. In a year that has been fraught with anxiety on every level, from food insecurity, worry about sick loved ones, fear of parental job loss to generalized anxiety and depression related to COVID, it is necessary to address this issue head on. We must remove the stigma of mental health struggles by talking about them and the impact they have on everyday life. I would love to say that the impetus for this was my idea but in truth, the idea was born out of a letter written by a student to the Board of Education and the Leadership Team of the district. The letter was an impassioned request for us to address the mental health needs of students. Although the student was able to see how much care the district was taking to keep everyone physically safe, her message to us was, in regards to mental health, "The kids are not alright." We felt compelled to take immediate action.

The Warrior Wellness Day will consist of a multidisciplinary presentation which will include breakout sessions on coping with anxiety and depression in ourselves and our friends. We will be partnering with Rensselaer County Mental Health, Capital Pride, Mental Health Association of NYS, Community Hospice, We Rise Consulting, and Arts Letters and Numbers, local yoga providers as well as embracing all the talent and expertise that Averill Park Central School District has to offer. All agencies are donating their time to us motivated by a generosity of spirit, an understanding that the kids, indeed, are not alright and a desire to change that for them in a way that is meaningful.

We hope to meet the following goals:

- Tap into each student's strength (art, music, exercise, mindfulness) to help them find a way to manage their emotions and feelings in a healthy, positive way that is specific to their own talents and interests.
- Remove the stigma of talking about mental health struggles and the impact they have on each of us.
- Educate everyone on what it is like to have anxiety and to have compassion for our friends and family members who are struggling.
- Develop strategies that can be used in the moment to decrease anxiety so that each student can fully engage in their education.


The first step in doing this is educating everyone about anxiety, giving this undefined fear a name, and opening the door for students to talk about it and to learn about it. A necessary step of dealing with anxiety and depression, especially in such a difficult time, is to understand anxiety and depression not as insurmountable obstacles, but rather as something that can be broken down into manageable parts in an attempt to break free from it's all encompassing grasp. An important

part of the day is the viewing of the film <u>ANGST</u>, which will help to set the tone of the day and will introduce us to all the topics in our goals.

The ANGST Movie is a 56-minute film that explores anxiety, its causes, effects, and what we can do about it. The filmmakers' goal is to have a global conversation and raise awareness around anxiety. ANGST features candid interviews with kids and young adults who suffer, or have suffered, from anxiety and what they've learned about it. The film includes discussions with mental health experts about the causes of anxiety and its sociological effects, as well as help, resources, and tools.

The resources and tools that will accompany the movie are staff/student discussions and debriefing sessions. The resources include, but are not limited to common questions, helpful websites, articles and books. Additionally, ANGST comes with guided questions for staff to use with students after the movie to help them identify their own triggers and coping strategies.

As adults we like to think that students will come to us for help. If you ask students what they need, their answer will always be each other. This movie shows students overcoming anxiety with the help of their friends as well as showing adults as people who can help. It highlights relationships with parents as well. We encourage parents to view the film along with their children if they are able.



Angst is an iNDIEFLIX Original documentary designed to raise awareness around anxiety.

Angst removes the stigma and opens up the conversation around anxiety, helping people understand and manage their symptoms, and when to reach out for help. Most importantly, it shows people that they are not alone, and that anxiety is 100% treatable.

This hopeful and inspiring film has helped over 2 million people around the world, weaving in the personal stories of those suffering with expert perspectives, who break down what's going on, how to deal with it, and how to help others. For many, watching Angst has been a catalyst for changing their lives for the better.
