

Project Type: Equipment**Project Goals and Description:**

Libraries have become more than a place to borrow books. We now teach 21st century technology skills and many libraries have incorporated "Maker Spaces." Maker Spaces allow students to explore STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) concepts in a safe space without the confines of a traditional classroom environment. Maker Spaces enable students to form ideas and learn from trial and error. Currently our elementary libraries use programmable robots, scraps of materials recycled or left over for constructing, ozobots (received from APEF Grant in 2015), and other miscellaneous educational materials for Maker Space activities.

As part of this Maker Space initiative we would like to incorporate Little Bits into our libraries. Little Bits are electronic building blocks that can be used similar to electronic circuits to build small systems with lightbulbs or engines. Little Bits are designed to be either a facilitated activity or tinkering tools for exploration and play based learning. School wide or grade level challenges extended by librarians can inspire students to explore and expand their knowledge on electrical circuits and build a foundation for understanding how computers work.

GRANT APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Averill Park Education Foundation exists solely for charitable and educational purposes to benefit the students of the Averill Park schools and works to support educational and creative initiatives to enrich programs and services for the students. The Foundation encourages teachers, students, and community members to help identify worthwhile projects for funding opportunities. Funds are distributed in the form of grants and project awards focused primarily in the academic subject areas, as well as technology, cultural enrichment, and general scholastic achievement. Consequently, grant requests submitted to the Foundation must demonstrate that the project/program and the funds requested will benefit our academic environment and our students.

All grants are subject to approval by the Foundation Board. In general, awards range from \$1,000 - 7,500, although larger proposals will be considered.

All proposals will receive a response generally within 6-8 weeks of each deadline. The dollar amount available for grants per year is directly related to the results of the annual fundraising campaign, and may vary from year to year. Depending upon the quality and number of proposals submitted each year, the number of grants awarded may also vary.

Grant awardees will be required to accept the following procedures:

- Submit a written report at the end of the project identifying completion of all established goals, an overview of the results, and recommendations (if any) for future projects;
- Submit a final accounting of all expenses, including budget v. actual, any income or additional funding, and any in-kind donations, if applicable.

Requests for grant renewals must follow the same procedure as initial grant proposal submissions. A prior award does not guarantee a renewal.

As a joint venture between Averill Park and Bethlehem High Schools, we are interested in bringing in former NBA player Chris Herren, who now serves as a motivational speaker on substance use and wellness, to engage our entire student body in a 1.5 hour assembly on these topics. Mr. Herren would appear for half a day at Averill Park, and then half a day at Bethlehem. We aim for this to occur on April 2, 2020. The location for the Averill Park assembly will be the high school auditorium. By joining with Bethlehem High School, we have received a reduced price per assembly from Chris Herren's organization.

The total cost of this assembly for the TWO schools is \$10,000. Bethlehem will cover half, at \$5000.00. We are working with a number of local agencies to help offset the Averill Park portion, also at \$5000.00 total. (See last question). We are requesting \$1500.00 from the Averill Park Ed Foundation to help support this endeavor.




