- All medications need to be picked up by 6/25/2024 at noon, please call to arrange a pick up time 518-674-7103.
- All students trying out for fall sports will need a physical on file that was completed after 8/31/2023.
- Students entering grades 7 and 9 will need a physical on file in the health office which was completed after 9/1/23.
- All students entering grade 6th must have received the T-dap immunization within 14 days of turning age 11.
- All students entering 7th grade must have received the meningococcal -A immunization.

NYS GRADE 8 SCIENCE ASSESSMENT
